On March 7, 2011, Judge James O. Shelfer of the Second Judicial Circuit Court ordered the liquidation of AequiCap Insurance Company ("AequiCap"). The Florida Department of Financial Services is the court appointed Receiver of AequiCap ("Receiver"). The company is currently licensed in 4 states – Florida, Georgia, Oklahoma, and South Carolina – and wrote primarily commercial auto and workers' compensation coverage.

The Receiver has advised that you hold a current active policy of insurance issued by Aequicap. This notice is sent in accordance with O.C.G.A. 33-36-8 and is intended to advise you that <u>under the liquidation order</u>, all AequiCap policies are cancelled effective 12:01 a.m. on April 6, 2011, unless it expires by its terms or is replaced prior to that date. The Receiver has further advised that under the liquidation order, the deadline for filing claims in the AequiCap Receivership is 11:59:59 p.m. on March 7, 2012. Information regarding the method for filing claims in the liquidation proceeding will be available on the Receiver's website in the near future.
