Sunday, November 3 at 2 a.m. marks the end of Daylight Saving Time. I encourage Floridians to check their smoke alarms as they adjust their clocks. Replace batteries in all smoke alarms as needed and test them to ensure they are working properly. With roughly <u>3 out of 5</u> fire deaths happening in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms testing your alarm is vital.

This week, the Federal Trade Commission announced members of the military will have access to free tools to help spot identity theft. As of yesterday (October 31), the nationwide credit reporting agencies—Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion—will provide free electronic credit monitoring services to active-duty servicemembers and National Guard



members. Florida's <u>65,000 active-duty</u> servicemembers are <u>twice as likely</u> to be targeted for scams. We must do everything possible to protect our service members and their families as they work to protect us at home and abroad. I encourage all eligible military service members who call the Sunshine State home to take advantage of this service to better protect themselves.
