To Venmo, PayPal, Cash App, and Zelle

As Florida's Chief Financial Officer, protecting Floridians and their financial interest is of paramount importance to me.

As you are aware, in late 2022 the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) signaled its intent to create a rule where transactions over \$600 via cash-apps would be taxed. The rule proves the Biden Administration isn't focused on "billionaires" – in order to pay for all their programs. This concept is plagued with problems. Moreover, taxing smaller dollar cash transactions doesn't equate to "income." For example, if parents helped with their son or daughter's gas bill via cash-app, their kids are now paying taxes. People aren't stupid; they're going to move to cash.

This is also the government colluding with Big Tech to get in the day-to-day business of Americans. (It's the first step in any George Orwell book.)
