**DIFS Would Like to Congratulate Det. Shane Gaghan** On receiving the Florida Fire Marshals and Inspectors Association (FFMIA) Fire Investigator of the Year award. Det. Gaghan has maintained a full caseload with the Bureau of Fire, Arson and Explosives Investigations (BFAEI) Tampa Field Office. Det, Gaghan has worked approximately 39 fires to date with 10 classified as incendiary fires, 6 cases cleared by arrest resulting in a 60% clearance by arrest rate, which more than triples the national average.




