BFAEI Detective Roland “Tony” Gray & ADC Mumsie

We are pleased to announce the retirement of Detective Tony Gray and ADC Mumsie. Detective Tony Gray has over 28 years of law enforcement experience. Tony began his career as an officer with the New York City Police Department (NYPD) in 1990 serving for 20 years until his retirement in 2011. During his time with the NYPD, Tony rose to the rank of detective and was awarded the NYPD Combat Cross, the second highest medal awarded by the NYPD. After the NYPD, Tony moved to Florida where he continued his law enforcement career as an officer with the Bay Harbor Islands Police Department in 2011 working general investigations. Tony was promoted to the rank of detective in 2013 and was later awarded the Police Officer of the Year, in 2014.

In May of 2015, Tony began his career with the Division of Investigative and Forensic Services as a detective with the Bureau of Fire, Arson & Explosives Investigations in the Jacksonville Field Office. In June of 2016, Tony transferred to the Tallahassee Field Office to accept the K-9 detective position where he was assigned to work with accelerant detection canine (ADC) Mumsie.

Mumsie came to the Division at 3 years old, after being trained through State Farm and Maine Specialty Dogs. Tony and Mumsie were a successful accelerant detection team for over four years before their retirement today.
