Fort Myers BFI Detective DeWayne White

We are pleased to announce the retirement of Detective DeWayne White after over 30 years in law enforcement. He began his career in June of 1987 as a dispatcher for the Escambia County Sheriff's Office (ECSO) in Pensacola, Florida. In December of 1990, DeWayne became a fulltime Sheriff's Deputy assigned to road patrol. During his time with the ECSO he rose to the rank of Master Deputy.

In 2013, DeWayne joined the Division of Investigative & Forensic Services, Bureau of Insurance Fraud; Where he was assigned to the General Fraud Squad in the Fort Myers Field Office. His duties consisted of Field Training Officer, Evidence Custodian, and was also the Lead Detective for several years. DeWayne was nominated for the 2019 FIFEC Law Enforcement Investigator of the Year and the Attorney General's 2019 Officer of the Year based on his investigation into a health care fraud ring responsible for over 42-million-dollars in fraudulent billing.
