Tips about Special Needs Trusts:

- You need a lawyer or financial advisor to help you.
- Setting up a trust costs money and takes time.

Finding the right lawyer:

The Florida Bar keeps a list of lawyers who are registered to help with trusts, who usually specialize in Elder Law.
