

- Started in July 2000
 - Developed by William Bingham, Fire Chief (ret).
 - The MISSION of ELSI is to provide an educational experience that is positive, current, and relevant and which addresses specific issues concerning the fire and emergency services



- Revised and re-released in early 2012 to include 6 modules
 - Human Resources and Labor Relations Module (HR)
 - Personal Qualities, Leadership, and the Organization Module (PQ)
 - Government Relations and Public Policy Module (GR)
 - Marketing Fire and Emergency Services Module (MF)
 - Finance and Budgeting Module (FB)*
 - Emergency Management Module (EM)*
 - (* added in 2012)

BFST Equivalency

- Complete all six (6) core modules
 - Submit equivalency request and completion certificates.
 - Receive equivalency for;
 - Chief Officer (60 hr. course toward FO III)
 - Personnel Mgmt. in the Fire Service (45 hr. course toward FO IV)
- Complete CRR elective module
 - Submit equivalency request and completion certificate.
 - Receive equivalency for;
 - Community Risk Reduction (45 hr. course toward FO IV).

- Currently in discussions with Valencia College to determine if these modules can translate to college credit toward Bachelor degree.
