What is a Virtual Classroom?



- Video conferencing tool where instructors and students engage with each other during an instructional/training session.
- Can be a live lecture, recorded training session, or a totally independent self-study session.



Virtual Classroom Components



- Utilizes learning materials in the form of documents, slide decks, or multi-media files
- Enhanced screen-sharing and virtual whiteboard features
- Allows for polls and quizzes to check student understanding
- Allows for student participation
- Allows for recorded sessions
- Allows for breakout sessions



Online Learning History



- 1892 University of Chicago (U.S. Postal Correspondence Courses)
- 1960s Linked-computer Systems
- 1982 CalCampus uses computers for virtual instruction
- 1989 University of Phoenix develops virtual classroom format for distance learning
- Early 1990s, Internet and Email Explosion
- 2019, 97% of all educational institutions move to online format due Covid-19



Pre-Covid/Covid Online Learning



- Top Hat Study: US and Canada
- 69% Online Learning is not as effective as in-person learning
- 66% Online Learning Experience is Not Engaging
- 75% Lack of Face-to-Face Interaction
- 24% Lack of Access
- NREMT: Only 10% of training allowed to be through online education

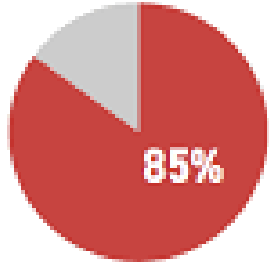


Post Covid Online Learning

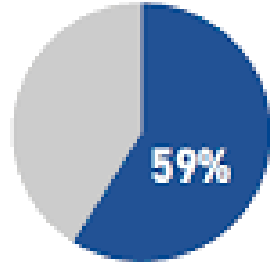


INSTITUTIONS REPORT DISTANCE EDUCATION LIKELY TO CONTINUE POST-PANDEMIC

Moved courses to emergency remote learning in Fall 2020 because of the pandemic



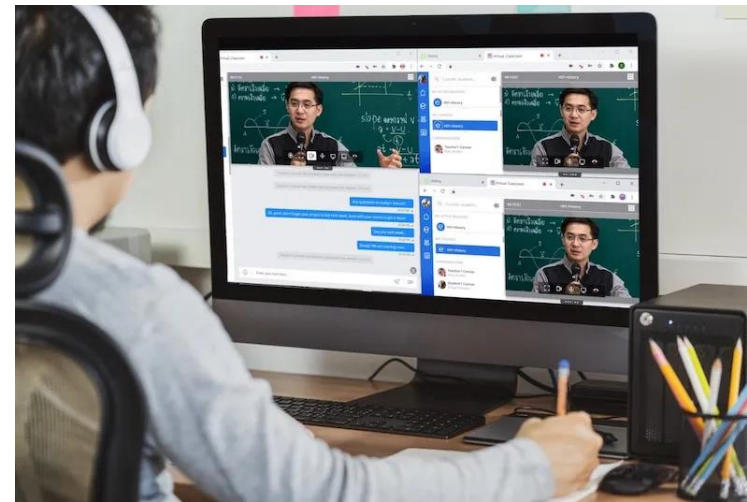
Plan to continue some or all of their emergency remote learning offerings via distance education after the pandemic

- 2023 Inside Higher Education Study
- 72% Reputable way to get Training/Education
- 84% Online training the same or better than classroom training
- 90% Online education as effective in equipping students with knowledge and skills
- NREMT: 100% of recertification training can come from virtual training options

Virtual Classroom Disadvantages




- Requires strong self-motivation and time management skills
