Course Title: Live Fire Training Instructor Refresher

Section II - Points of Contact

Training Supervisor:

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This 8-hour course will review incidents that have occurred, cover program updates, legislative issues, practical applications, case histories, and new technologies. The program will be required to be completed for renewal of the Live Fire Training Instructor certification. The course includes an update of the changes to NFPA 1403 found in the 2012 and 2018 edition, a review of State laws pertaining to live fire exercises and a review and discussion of trainee and instructor fatalities in the live fire environment.

Section IV - Course Materials, Grading, and Attendance

Required Book(s): NFPA 1403, 2012 & 2018 ed., entire publication including appendixes; Florida Administrative Code 69A and 633 (requirements for Live Fire Training for Certified Personnel; requirements for live fire training during recruit training; certification prerequisites for live fire training instructor training; live fire instructor training requirements; live fire training

Prerequisite(s): BFST/ATPC3530 Live Fire Training Instructor Program; Firefighter II; Fire Instructor I

Contact Hours: This class has 8 contact hours.

Continuing Educations Units (CEU's): 8 CEU's towards (recertification of Live Fire Training Instructor and Instructor I, II, III)

Pre-Course Assignment: None

Required Materials: Paper, pens, USB portable storage device (thumb drive)

Grading: Students must achieve a minimum cumulative score of 80% to pass this course. Course grades are determined from activities and a final exam. Below is the breakdown of the final accumulative grading:

- Group Activities 50 points
- Final Written Exam 50 points

Attendance: Students are required to attend the entire 8-hour session of this course.

Section V - Instructor Qualifications

As per Chapter Florida Administrative Codes (Rule), *Programs of Study and Vocational Courses*, instructors must meet the following qualifications to be authorized to teach this course:

Rule: 69A-37.407 Live Fire Instructor Training.

- (1) All Live Fire Training Instructor training must be conducted by a certified Live Fire Training Instructor II.
- (2) Training to be a Live Fire Training Instructor will be provided by the Florida State Fire College, or by the agencies or institutions approved pursuant to the provisions of sections 633.408(1) and 633.444, F.S., and chapter 69A-37, F.A.C., inclusive of interior and exterior burn props.
- (3) All Live Fire Training Instructor training must be completed by a certified Live Fire Training Instructor II under the direction of a Live Fire Master Trainer.

69A-37.408 Live Fire Training Instructor Certification and Renewal.

- (1) Successful completion of a Florida State Fire College approved certification test encompassing course objectives and materials with a passing score of 85% is required for certification.
- (2) For quadrennial renewal, a person is required to complete the 8 hour LFTI renewal course and each person seeking renewal must have participated as a primary instructor, IIC, or SO during the four year period on a fully compliant live training fire exercise.
- (3) Any Live Fire Training must be conducted with a properly certified instructor employed by or as a volunteer of a fire department or a training center in compliance with rule 69A-37.060, F.A.C.

Section VI – Job Performance Requirements

NFPA 1403, Standard on Live Fire Training Evolutions 2012 Edition

4.6.6 All instructors shall be qualified by the AHJ to deliver live fire training.
