The FFIRS section is currently in the process of wrapping up 2009 reporting. The deadline for all fire departments for submitting data to FFIRS is April 30, 2010. The deadline for data to be included in the national fire incident reporting is July 1, 2010.

### NFIRS Status Update:

Keith McCarthy had the opportunity to attend the National Fire Information Council Training Workshop. The focus of the workshop was NFIRS quality assurance at local, state, and national levels with the theme being "Fighting Fires with Facts". The workshop topics included; upcoming enhancements, quality assurance, NFPA's use of NFIRS data and research.

The 2009 NFIRS report shows 21,530 fire departments reporting 17.7 million incidents reports.

FFIRS data submitted for 2009 to USFA, NFIRS represent 12.5% of the incidents in the national database.

All fire department audits were completed as of March 31, 2010 for 2009 data. All departments have received a letter, audit sheet, and multiple attachments explaining where their data showed errors and where their departments data stood as of June for 2009.

Data submitted to USFA, NFIRS for 2009 had an error percentage of .14%.

91.2% of Florida fire departments are participating in the FFIRS program. This is a 4% increase.

The FFIRS section has still been unsuccessful in recruiting Hillsborough County.

### Training:

An introduction to the FFIRS program was given to Miami Beach. We have recently received a request from Miami-Dade and the City of Miami for formal training.

The FFIRS department will start working on the Annual Report on May 1, 2010. (Annual Report 2009)

Susan MacHenry, gave a presentation at the Training Workshop and reported that USFA has been working in conjunction with EMS entities to come up with some sort of reporting tool that will relieve the pressure off of the local fire departments from filling out two separate reports. That is very encouraging news.
