- As on October 5, 2020, 389 departments have reported, 84% of total users.
- FFIRS has processed 1,195,961 incidents for a loss of \$238,830,196
- Fire related casualties;
 - Injuries: Civilian 381 Firefighter 2,737
 Deaths Civilian 83 Firefighter 2
- FFIRS Updates
 - o 2019 report nearing publication graphics will look different this year
- All fire departments who have completed 100% reporting will receive a Certificate of Participation with their 2019 Annual Report
- FFIRS upgrade, with Chief Buckles, making significant progress.
- New National NFIRS reporting system (eNFIRS) will be fully web-based, you can access on any device
- At the national level, there is a data enterprise warehouse that currently is only available to state program managers that will hopefully be available to all users
- Accessing data should be faster and easier
- Upcoming training will be determined on new systems being implemented

REPORT FROM EMS: given by Thomas DiBernardo, Bureau of EMS

- 4.1 million EMS records
- Over 50% of records, real time (within a day)
- 90% of 911 records being received
- Currently have trauma registry, crash record database, opioid database, outcome measures from hospitals coming soon
- Looking forward to linking/sharing data (Fire/EMS)
- Things have been a bit idle because of COVID, (170-day deployments) back on track and the next meeting will be a virtual meeting held in November
